Monographic study, coordinated by prof. univ. dr. Olimpia Mitric.

Lăcrămioara Agrigoroaiei – museographer at the National Museum of Romanian Literature Iasi. Education: graduate of the “Spiru Haret” University of Bucharest (Faculty of Romanian Language and Literature), master’s degree in Theology (“Alexandru Ioan Cuza” University of Iasi, Faculty of Roman Catholic Theology), postgraduate courses of museum and art gallery custody and museology. Scientific activity: coordinator of numerous cultural and educational activities at the “Mihail Sadoveanu” Museum in Iasi; author of articles and communications, which capitalize on the patrimony of the National Museum of Romanian Literature, published in various publications in Romania (“Dacia literară”, “Revista Română”, “Însemnări ieșene”, Anuarul MNLR Iași etc.); interventions on radio and television.

Ionel Antimirescu – history teacher at the “Simion Mehedinți” High School, Vidra, Vrancea; PhD student of the “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava. President of the Local Action Group “Țara Vrancei”, vice-president of the Association of Vrancea Communities, member of the Methodological Teaching Corps of the Vrancea County School Inspectorate. Author of the works: *Contribuții la monografia comunei Nistorești, județul Vrancea*, București, 2016; *Contribuții la studiu epocii bronzului în spațiul Carpaților și Subcarpaților Curburii*, Focșani, 2016; *Evoluția constituțională a României*, in the volume: *Comunități locale românești și Unirea*, Adjud, 2018.

Sanda-Maria Ardeleanu – professor of Linguistics at “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava, Department of Foreign Languages and Literature, Faculty of Letters and Communication Sciences; PhD coordinator (philology-linguistics field); (Co) Coordinator of the French Diploma Master's Degree “Theory and Practice of Translation”, Suceava – Chisinau; Director of Discourse Analysis Research Center of “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava; editor-in-chief of ANADISS; Co-supervisor of the University Success Center; coordinator of the “Ștefan cel Mare” University Library in Suceava. Author/co-author of 116 articles published in the country, 54 articles published abroad, 9 courses, 25 books and textbooks. Editor of the Series “Language Sciences”, at the European Institute Publishing House in Iași (since 2006); coordinator of book collections – “Romanian intellectuals of French expression”, “Didactics of translation”, “Poale-n brâu” (old Romanian gastronomy), “Azimut”, “Eugeniu Coșeriu” archives – at the “Demiurg” Editorial House in Iași, together with Johannes Kabatek and Cristina Bleorțu. Member of scientific, professional or cultural societies: Association Roumaine des Départements Universitaires Francophones, “Al. I. Cuza” University of Iași; Association of the Order “Palme Académiques”; The Functional Linguistics Society, Paris.

Ovidiu Bătă – engineer geologist, scientific researcher III at the “Bukovina” Institute of Romanian Academy. PhD in Geology (2006) at the “Al. I. Cuza” University of Iași, with the thesis *Palynostratigraphical Study of the Metamorphic Formations from Putna Basin (Bistrița Mountains)*. Fields of interest: geology, exploitation of mineral resources, environmental protection. Author of books, studies and articles about the economic life of Bukovina.

Ioan Bolovan – Vice-Rector of the Babeş-Bolyai University of Cluj-Napoca, professor at the Faculty of History and Philosophy – Scientific researcher at the Romanian Academy, Transylvania Studies Center and Director of the “George Barițiu” Institute of History of the Romanian Academy. Area of Concerns: Modern and contemporary history of Romania, especially the history of Transylvania in the 19th–20th centuries, population history and historical demography. Scientific activity: over 200 books, studies and articles in specialized journals and collective volumes in the country and abroad (Italy, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Serbia etc.) Awards: “Mihail Kogălniceanu” Prize of the Romanian Academy in 2002. International affiliations: member since 2008 of the International Commission for Historical Demography (ICHD), since September 2010 is vice-president and since August 2015 president of ICHD headquartered in Geneva; also member of ICM Gorizia, Italy (since February 2008).

Gheorghe Cliveti – corresponding member of the Romanian Academy, director of the “A. D. Xenopol” History Institute in Iasi. Areas of interest: modern history (Romanian and European history), history of international relations, political history and institutions, political ideas and movements, state and society, social history, concepts, methodologies. He published studies, articles, reviews and bibliographical notes in specialized journals and in thematic volumes, he wrote books on Romania and the Guarantor Powers, Romanian liberalism, international relations in the modern era, French Europe and the cause of Romanian (1789–1871), Romania and the German “alliances” (1879–1914), modern Romania and the “peak of Europe” (1815–1914), the history of the University of Iasi; coordinator of volumes of Romanian history and author of critical editions, director of fundamental research projects.

Mircea A. Diaconu – professor and vice-rector of “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava, a specialist in Romanian literature, literary critic and historian, chief editor of the journal “Meridian Critic”, and member of the Writers’ Union of Romania. He published several volumes about Romanian poetry and prose. He also edited the works of the Bukovinian writers such as Mircea Streinul, Traian Chelariu, Iulian Vesper and Teofil Lianu. The essays published by professor Diaconu refer to the condition of literary criticism. He collaborated with other writers on the volume entitled *Romanian Literature as World Literature* (Bloomsbury, USA, 2018).

Marin Gherman – associate professor of the “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava, director of the Institute of Political Studies and Social Capital (Chernivtsi, Ukraine), president, founder and editor-in-chief of the BucPress Media Center – an association of Romanian journalists in Ukraine; journalist at the publication “Libertatea” (Bucharest), columnist at Veridica, deputy editor-in-chief of the history and culture magazine “Glasul Bucovinei” (Chernivtsi – Bucharest). He defended his doctoral thesis at the Chernivtsi National University “Yuri Fedkovič” in the field of political science. Author of studies published in specialized journals, co-author of monographs: *Societatea civilă și capitalul social în noile state membre ale UE* (Cernăuți, Tehnodruk, 2015), *Sprache Politik und Konflikte in der Ukraine, Republik Moldau und Georgien* (Leipzig, 2017), *Peisajul emocultural și etnopolitic al regiunilor de frontieră din Ucraina, R. Moldova și România. Retrospectivă istorică și actualitate* (Chernivtsi, Tehnodruk, 2018), *Intersecții educative: dialog cu minoritățile naționale din regiunile Cernăuți și Transcarpatia* (Drogobici, Tek-LTD, 2020); contributor to the volume *COVID-19. Dimensiuni ale gestionării pandemiei* (Iași, Editura Junimea, 2020).

Luzian Geier – former researcher of the Bukowina Institute Augsburg/Germany, specialized on the history of multilingual press from Banat between 1771 and 1981; editor and chief-editor of the „Kaendl-Archiv” magazine of the Bukowina-Institute in Augsburg and, since 1994, the chief editor of the monthly publication of the Association of Bukovinean Germans. Luzian Geier is the author of many studies in history and history of culture, also the author of many articles published in scientific books and magazines.

Rodica Jugrin – scientific researcher III at the “Bukovina” Institute of the Romanian Academy; PhD in History (2004), with a thesis on the cultural life in Bukovina in the interwar period. Areas of interest: contemporary history, oral history and history of mentalities. She edited several volumes about the history of Bukovina and published books, studies and articles on the evolution of the cultural phenomenon in the province during the interwar period (institutions, personalities), parliamentary life, and anti-communist resistance.

Ortfried Kotzian – former director of the Department of Pedagogy of the “Bukovina” Institute in Augsburg. Ortfried Kotzian carried on a fruitful activity in the Regional Schwaben Board. He is designated counselor of cultural affairs, then superior counselor and, ultimately, director of the department for culture of the same institution. In 2002 – awarded, for distinctive merits, with the “Sieben Schwaben” Medal. Also former director of the Haus des Deutschen Ostens in Munich, Germany. Among the various papers published, we mention: *Das Schulwesen der Deutschen in Rumänien im Spannungsfeld zwischen Volksgruppe und Staat* (Augsburg, 1984); *Die Aussiedler und ihre Kinder: Eine Forschungsdokumentation über die Deutschen im Osten* (Dillingen-Munich, 1991); *Spurensuche in die Zukunft. Europas vergessene Region Bukowina* (with Johannes Hampel, Augsburg, 1991); *Die Umsiedler: die Deutschen aus West-Wolhynien, Galizien, der Bukowina, Bessarabien, der Dobrudscha und in der Karpatenukraine* (Munich, 2005).

Ilie Molea – missionary priest of the Archpriest of Rădăuți, former Erasmus scholar (internship) in Thessalonica, Greece within the Neo-Greek Language School of the Aristotle-Thessalonica University and master student at the “Dumitru Stăniloae” Faculty of Orthodox Theology -Iași, in the field of “Communication and Spiritual and Psychological Counselling”, having as theme of dissertation “Priests from Bukovina of yesteryear: Iračlie Porumbescu, Ioan Puiu and Casian Bucescu”. Coordinator of the pastoral circles assigned to the archpriest of Rădăuți, organizing meetings on different (including historical) topics, priestly conferences, missionary visits etc. Area of interest: History of the Orthodox Church in Bukovina.

Marian Olaru – scientific researcher at the “Bukovina” Institute of the Romanian Academy. PhD in History (2000). Fields of interest: modern and contemporary history, oral history, microhistory and history of mentalities. He published various studies and articles related to the history of Bukovina, regarding the evolution of the political system in this region during the Austrian occupation, the role of personalities, cultural and political elite from this region in advocating the identity at the end of the XIXth century and beginning of the 20th century. He also showed a particular interest in studying the context (phenomena) that resulted in the extinction of the multicultural and multiethnic Bukovina at the end of the Second World War, a process emphasized by the establishment of communist rule in the Central and Eastern Europe.

Liviu Papuc – librarian at the “Mihai Eminescu” Central University Library, of Iași (1984–1992), head of the same institution since 1992. Ph.D *cum laude*, thesis title: *Leca Morariu. Viața și opera. Studiu monografic*, “Al. I. Cuza” University of Iași, 2002. Member of the Writers Union since 1998. Collaborations with various magazines: “Convorbiri literare”, “Biblioteca și cercetarea” (Cluj-Napoca), “Memoria etnologica” (Baia Mare), “Basarabia” (Republic of Moldavia, Chișinău) ș.a. – Editor of: Leca Morariu work *Jurnal vâlcean (1944–1948)*, printed at TipoMoldova Publishing House, Iași, 2012, 516 p. (Edition, Notes and Foreword, together with Constantin Poenaru); *Drumuri prin Basarabia românească*, Notes, Foreword, Antology and Testimony by L. Elena Pascaniuc – scientific researcher III at the “Bukovina” Institute of the Romanian Academy (Rădăuți); PhD student at the “Ștefan cel Mare” University in Suceava, with a thesis on the folklore in Bukovina. Areas of interest: cultural life in Bukovina, history of folklore in Bukovina. She published studies and articles on these topics in the periodicals: “Analele Bucovinei” (Rădăuți – București); “Meridian Critic”, Analele Universității “Ștefan cel Mare” Suceava, Seria Filologie; “Scriptum” (Suceava).

Ihor Piddubny – studied at the Faculty of History of the “Yurii Fedkivici” State University in Chernivtsi, specializing in world history. In 1986–1998 he worked at the Chernivtsi Local History Museum. In January 1997 he defended the candidate’s thesis “The socio-political and cultural life of the Ukrainians in Bukovina in the interwar period (1918–1940)”; since 1998 he has been an assistant at the Department of Ancient and Medieval History of the “Yurii Fedkivici” State University Chernivtsi; assistant (2001), then associate professor (2004) of the Department of Modern and Contemporary History. In 2020 he defended his doctoral thesis “Parties, Parliament, King and Government. The development and interaction of the elements of the political system of Romania in the years 1918–1940”.

Aurel-Gheorghe Prepeliuc – graduate of the „Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava, currently a PhD student of the same university. Since 1997 he has been working as a museographer at the National Museum of Bukovina as an ethnographer and expert in mobile patrimony of wood and folk architecture in Bukovina.

Ștefan Purici – is currently professor at the Department of History and International Relations of the Faculty of History and Geography of the “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava and Dean of this Faculty; PhD in History (1995) with a thesis on the Romanian national movement in the Bukovina (1775–1861). He teaches contemporary history of the Romanian people and history of European integration. Author of 4 books and over 100 articles on modern and contemporary history.

Harieta Mareci-Sabol – is associated professor at the Faculty of History and Geography of the “Ștefan cel Mare” University of Suceava; PhD in History at the “Alexandru Ioan Cuza” University of Iași (2002), with a thesis on the Romanian historiography. Her monographs, studies and articles pertaining to modern history, history of Bukovina and historiography were published in Romania, Poland, Italy, Turkey and Ukraine. Her research interests include Bukovina’s personalities and its cultural, social, and medical history.

Ștefănița-Mihaela Ungureanu – scientific researcher III; PhD in 2020, with a thesis on the history of the press in Bucovina. Areas of interest: German press and literature in Bukovina, translations from/into German; publishes studies and articles about the German language press and literature of Bukovina.
